FOLLOW OUR STEP-BY-STEP APPLICATION PROCESS



USAC admits students on a rolling admissions basis where applications are reviewed as they are received. As a result, programs may fill to capacity before the end of the application cycle. Only complete applications will be reviewed. We encourage you to apply during the early admission period to increase the likelihood of available space. Once a program has reached capacity, USAC will continue to admit qualified students to a waiting list for placement as spots open.

A complete application consists of an online application and signed program agreement accompanied by a personal essay, an academic transcript, and a \$100 non-refundable application fee. Additionally, approval from your home university may also be required.

USAC Welcomes Applications From Students Who:

- are at least 18 years old at the time of application and who will be enrolled in a university degree-seeking program while they are abroad
- have a grade point average of 2.5 or higher on a 4.0 scale
- are in good academic, disciplinary, and community standing
- meet any additional pre-requisites of the program to which they are applying

The Application Process

1. Complete the initial online application at usac.edu/apply.
2. Receive preliminary admissions decision via email along with login instructions for your USAC Student Gateway account.
3. Login to your USAC Student Gateway account, complete remaining application requirements, and pay the \$100 non-refundable application fee. (Home university approval may also be required.)
4. If everything checks out — receive formal USAC admissions offer via email.
5. Accept your spot on the program and submit \$500 enrollment confirmation deposit if not paid directly to USAC by your home university. (Deposit is applied to program fees and is refundable until the end of the early admission period.)
6. Once your enrollment has been confirmed, watch your mailbox for your official USAC Welcome Packet and Student Toolkit and start preparing for your journey.

- Personalized pre-departure advising and support



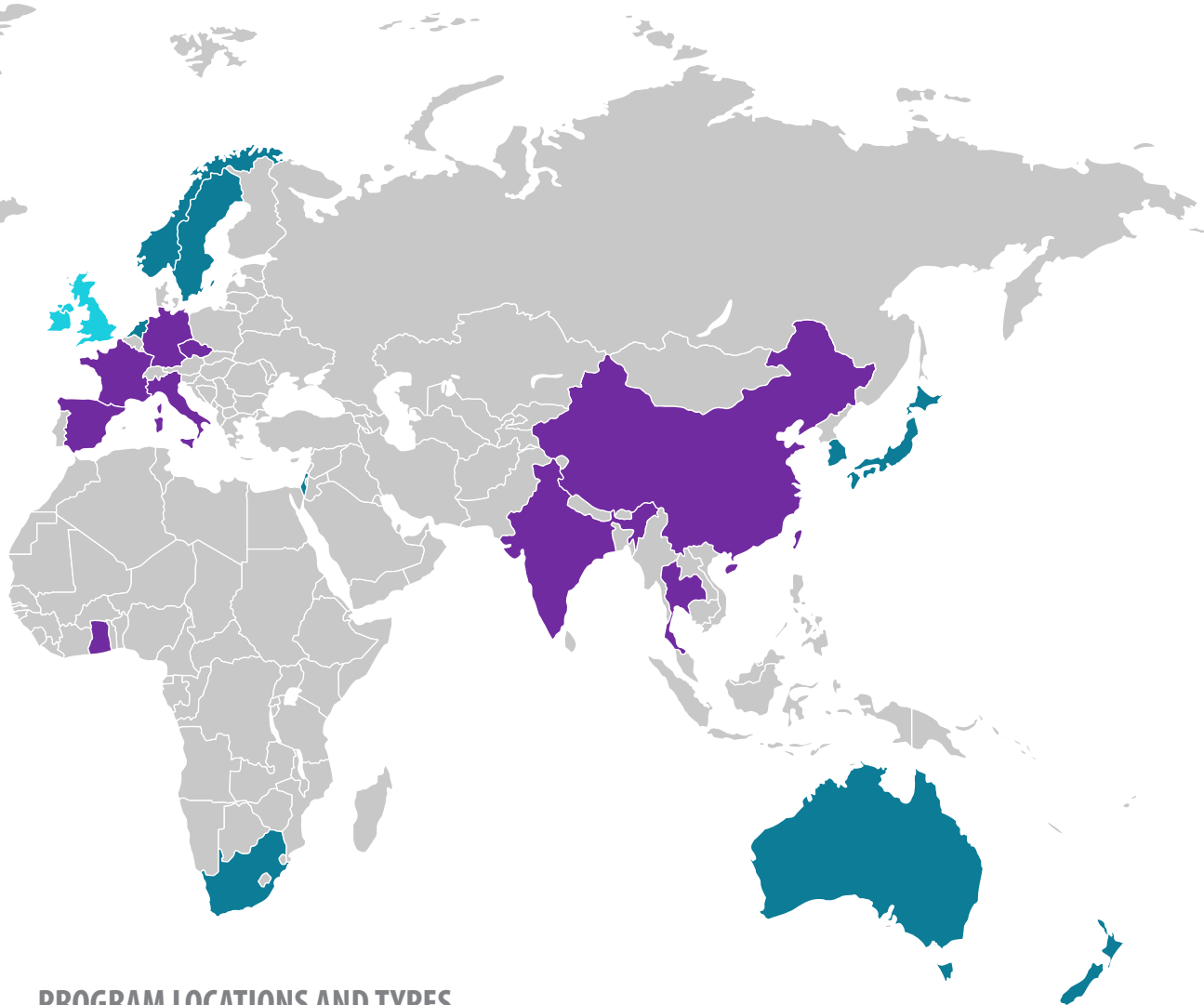
Partnership Programs

Eligibility

- **Minimum 3.0 GPA**
- **Junior standing (at time of internship)**
- **Foreign language proficiency (some placements)**
- **Any additional prerequisites of the internship placement site such as a higher GPA, prior coursework, or a specific major**

A refundable \$200 fee is charged once you have been accepted in your program and will be returned upon successful completion of the internship.

Internship applications are available in the USAC Student Gateway and are available after admission to your program. Early submission is highly recommended.

Internships vary by site are not available every term.

INTERNSHIPS

EARN ACADEMIC CREDIT WHILE GAINING PROFESSIONAL EXPERIENCE

USAC internships are rich resources for your academic and professional development and are an extraordinary way to immerse yourself in your program country's culture, meet locals, and practice your language skills. Internships are optional and are included in your program fees. They range from one to three credits and are taken in addition to your minimum course credit load.

While local language proficiency is not required for all placements, your language comprehension may determine which placements you're eligible for.

Some areas of placement include: Marketing and Communications, Education, Language, Hospitality and Hotel Management, Architecture, Biology and Environmental Sciences, Agriculture Health, Medical and Dental, Finance, Economics, International Business, Social Work, Music and Art, and Non-Governmental Organizations.

My mentors and fellow students immediately made me feel welcomed and little-by-little began introducing me to new perspectives of this field.

Having these experiences and opportunities with the Center for Tropical Apiculture Studies (CINAT) has changed my focus as an environmental science student. Prior to my internship, I was unaware just how diverse apiculture truly was. The animal husbandry, economic, chemistry, behavioral, education, and conservation focuses are all perspectives within the field of apiculture that I had the opportunity to learn about firsthand.
