GALAPAGOS

Sustainable tourism and conservation

Students will analyze the competing needs of human development and environmental protection. Eco-tourism offers an alternative income-source to formerly unsustainable fisheries but has created a new set of pressures on island society and its environment. Conservation problems and solutions will be explored that might provide a sustainable balance for man and nature in Galapagos.

GALAPAGOS

Marine, coastal, or terrestrial Ecology

For example: Mangroves forests grow in saline coastal habitats in the tropics and subtropics. They provide numerous roles in the coastal ecosystem, serving as habitat to hundreds of species, helping to improve and maintain water quality, and protect shorelines from damaging storms, waves, and floods. In the Galapagos, they are unfortunately under threat by local development.





GALAPAGOS

Human-Wildlife Conflict Management

A review of the key principles, concepts, methods, and techniques of protected areas management, combined with a strong emphasis on practical exercises, field work, and case studies both from developing countries and the United States.

CUBA

Conservation and Marine Ecosystems

This course will prepare students to better understand the challenges of conservation biology, the maintenance, loss, and restoration of biological diversity, and global sustainability, environmental quality, and socio-economic well-being for current and future generations.





GALAPAGOS

Darwin's playground: explore the cradle of evolution

There's a reason why many of the world's most famous scientists have visited the Galapagos Islands—now it's your turn to discover one of the most beautiful and biologically diverse archipelagos. You will visit four of the Galapagos Islands, immersing yourselves in this pristine environment, seeing blue-footed boobies, land tortoises, sea turtles, penguins, marine iguanas, and hundreds of other species.

CUBA

Culture, language, and architecture

You will explore Old Havana and learn about the history of the city. You will also visit other important historical and cultural sites and go on architectural explorations of Havana's distinct and unique features. Additionally, we will have talks and round table discussions on Cuban socioeconomic and political systems with experts from the Latin American Social Sciences Institute (FLACSO).



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INDEPENDENT RESEARCH PROJECTS



An independent research project is an excellent starting point for students aspiring to write a senior or master thesis. It is also ideal preparation for future graduate work.

Those interested should review IOI's project pages to become familiar with our projects and objectives, review the suggested research focuses, and ensure there is a good fit with their own interest and studies. Prior to departure, students should check in with their advisors at the home college or university to see if there are any additional requirements for students conducting independent research abroad.
