A WARM WELCOME UPON ARRIVAL

Friendly API Resident Directors/Coordinators meet students upon arrival at the airport. Students also take part in a group orientation, including a welcome lunch or dinner, so they can get to know their new friends as well as the API Resident Director/Coordinator.

All API programs include excursions that introduce you to wonderful destinations in your host country. Many of our programs also include international excursions. Wherever possible, API excursions offer more comfort and safer travel by using private means of transportation, including chartered buses, airlines and high-speed trains.

API takes pride in being available to students and their families during all phases of the study abroad experience- pre-departure, on-site and re-entry. API provides quality housing that is safe and located near the university or city centers. Local API directors carefully screen all housing options prior to student arrival. Many programs offer multiple types of housing (apartments, local host families and/or dormitories) to appeal to every student interest.

IT'S ALL IN THE DETAILS

ADVISING

API staff members happily guide students through the administrative processes of the pre-departure phase of study abroad. Students and their families may contact API staff as often as needed with questions about academics, on-site logistics, visa procedures, housing, safety concerns and anything else. API staff members, in turn, are frequently in touch with students regarding program updates, essential travel tips and recommendations for having a successful experience abroad. API staff can also connect students with API alumni who welcome the opportunity to share their API experiences with future students.

ORIENTATION MATERIALS AND RESOURCES

All API students receive comprehensive orientation information to help them prepare for their study abroad session. API orientation materials include information on logistical details, cultural differences, what students can expect at their host university, health and safety concerns, travel tips and more. API students also have access to language diagnostic exams and language reviews (in some sites). Additionally, in certain locations, API offers pre-departure orientation sessions for students and their families on the home campus.

RESIDENT DIRECTORS/COORDINATORS

API has highly qualified, trained and experienced English-speaking, Resident Directors/Coordinators in every site who are available to students throughout their session abroad. Most Resident Directors/Coordinators are locals from the host country in which students will be studying and all are ready to provide practical information and insight into the host culture. Resident Directors/ Coordinators greet students at the airport, introduce students to the ways of life in their host country, help students to register at the host institution and support students throughout their stay. They are also available in case of any personal emergency and are ready to implement the API emergency response plans, if needed.

AIRPORT RECEPTION

API students are met at the airport and welcomed to their new home by API onsite staff on the program start date.

ON-SITE ORIENTATION

The on-site orientation takes place during the first week of a student's stay. API orientations include city tours as well as practical information about life in the host city, including transportation, safety and local culture. The orientation is designed to minimize adjustment difficulties upon arrival and gives students an opportunity to get to know other participants.

EXCURSIONS

Students have the opportunity to broaden their classroom education through several organized excursions, which are included in the price of the program. (In many locations, international excursions are included!) Overnight lodging, breakfast, entrance fees and transportation to and from the excursion locations are included. Excursions are subject to change depending on availability, weather and other factors.

SOCIAL AND CULTURAL ACTIVITIES

Students are offered monthly API-sponsored social and cultural activities, including outings to movies, concerts, cultural tours, theater performances, museums, outdoor activities, cooking classes and more. All entrance fees are covered by API. Students also enjoy both welcome and farewell group meals.



VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES

Organized by API Resident Directors/Coordinators in many locations, the API Gives Back Project may consist of an ongoing volunteer opportunity or a oneday commitment. The goal of the project is to help API students express their thanks for the welcome they received from the local community. Students may also choose to add-on a volunteer program to the beginning or end of their study abroad experience in some locations.

MEDICAL AND LIFE INSURANCE

The health and safety of our participants is our number one priority. Medical and life insurance is provided for all students during the program term. The coverage includes medical evacuation and repatriation, as well as 24-hour support for medical issues. Our insurance plan is designed to help cover the care students need to get better.

TUITION

All programs include a fixed number of credits per term as part of the standard fee. The number of credits that a student can earn each session is detailed on each program page. API encourages students to meet with their advisors to get courses and credits approved prior to departure.

HOUSING

Housing is included in the program fee.* Depending on the host city, students may choose from various housing options, including host families, apartments, or student dormitories. Students can request single rooms on their housing form for an additional cost, although some sites may have guaranteed single rooms as part of the program fee. A \$275 security deposit is due by the final payment deadline for all programs. A fee of \$95 will be retained from all security deposits to cover standard cleaning fees and general maintenance fees, including minor repairs and standard touch-up painting. The remaining \$180 is refundable provided that: 1) no additional fees are assessed for on-site incidentals, damages, or excessive utility usage; and 2) the API program fee has been paid in full.

Housing for most academic year students during the period between the fall and spring semesters is not included in the API program fee. Students can take advantage of this time to return home to the U.S. or to travel independently. In most cases, API can arrange between-term housing for students in their host city for an additional fee. Refer to the city information sections or the API website for more specific housing information by location.

API LEARNING AND ENGAGEMENT DIGITAL BADGE PROGRAM

API offers participants the opportunity to maximize their time abroad by earning digital badges that reflect activities completed before, during and after a participant's international experience. Digital badges can be earned in the areas of Career Development, Community Engagement, Intercultural Learning, Leadership and Mindful Travel. Digital badges can be displayed on résumés, e-portfolios, personal branding and online web presence. Badges are an opportunity for students to show their college or university, potential employers and their community how they made the most of their experience abroad.

TRANSCRIPT

Upon completion of the academic session, an official transcript from an accredited institution with a letter of translation (if necessary) is sent to each student's home institution. API encourages students to discuss their academic choices with home institution advisors prior to departure to determine how credits reflected on the transcript might be transferred toward their degree plan.

ALUMNI NETWORK AND PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT OPPORTUNITIES

Returning students have the opportunity to continue to be engaged with API through a variety of alumni opportunities. API continues to support participants post-experience through the API alumni network, job postings and items of interest in the API Alumni Facebook and LinkedIn groups and through **API's Global Leadership Academy**. The Global Leadership Academy offers API alumni the opportunity to build core competencies of global leadership in a dynamic and creative atmosphere. The program helps participants develop skills to share their experience in their community, on campus and in job interviews. Students host collaborative events to share their international story and learn to integrate their international experience into their chosen career path.


WHAT HAPPENS NEXT?

CONTINUOUS ACCESS TO APPLICATION

API encourages students to visit their **@api** online account frequently to determine if there are any supplementary materials that must be submitted to complete the application.

PROMPT NOTIFICATION OF ACCEPTANCE

API Program Managers/Coordinators promptly contact students once a completed application has been received. Accepted students are notified by phone and receive an acceptance e-mail with detailed post-acceptance instructions and materials.



LET'S TALK SCHOLARSHIPS AND MONEY



Financing your API program is one of the most important parts of going abroad, but it can also be one of the most stressful. API encourages students to start planning EARLY.

API also urges participants to read our financial policies and discuss these with their parents and/or study abroad advisors before applying. SCHOLARSHIP DEADLINES

SCHOLARSHIP REQUIREMENTS

- Student must have a cumulative G.P.A. of 3.0 or higher (2.75 for First Gen and STEM).
- Student must have applied and been accepted to an API program.
- Scholarship recipients will be required to submit one blog post during or immediately following their study or intern abroad program. The submission must comply with API's policies regarding language and subject matter, and API will retain the rights to edit and publish this post on its social media, website and API advising materials, as appropriate.

ALL PAYMENTS ARE DUE TO API BEFORE PROGRAM START. The only exception to this API standard is if you are using financial aid to pay for all or a portion of your final payment amount due.

API makes all arrangements for students well before arrival on-site. As a result, API must collect all fees prior to the start of the semester. These arrangements can include securing your quality housing, submitting tuition deposits and fees at your host university, and arranging transport and lodging for orientation and excursions. CAN I USE MY FINANCIAL AID TO PAY FOR MY PROGRAM?

YES, API ACCEPTS ALL FORMS OF FINANCIAL

AID as long as there is approval from the home university or organization. However, API does not issue or offer financial aid.

Once proof of financial aid is provided through the submission of a completed Financial Aid Verification Form (FAVF), provided once accepted, API then adjusts a student's payment schedule based on disbursement dates of financial aid awards. This FAVF form acts as a deferral for any final payment amount covered by the financial aid. This form must be submitted by the date of the original final payment deadline. Then, the amount of financial aid on your API account will be given a new due date, usually two weeks after your financial aid disbursement date.

DOES API OFFER PAYMENT PLANS?

NO, BUT API DOES OFFER A FINAL PAYMENT EXTENSION PLAN called the Alternative Payment Arrangement (APA), which will extend your final payment deadline to 30 days before your program start date.

Please note that the APA is not considered a payment plan as API makes all arrangements on the student's behalf prior to the program start, and, as such, cannot grant extended plans past the program start date.

Many students who are unable to pay their program balance or provide a finalized financial aid verification form by their final payment deadline choose to sign up for the APA plan.

WHAT IF I WITHDRAW FROM MY PROGRAM?

CAN I SAFEGUARD PROGRAM PAYMENTS? YES, API DOES OFFER A WAY FOR YOU TO PAY TO SAFEGUARD THE MAJORITY OF YOUR PROGRAM PAYMENTS for a withdrawal BEFORE PROGRAM START.

API offers a Program Withdrawal Safeguard (PWS) for its participants as an optional service. The PWS is designed to safeguard program participants' financial investment in their study abroad experience in case of program withdrawal before the program start date for any reason.

HOW TO USE YOUR FINANCIAL AID

YES! FINANCIAL AID MAY WORK FOR YOU ABROAD!

API accepts all forms of financial aid according to approval from the home university or organization. However, API does not issue or offer financial aid.

API Financial Services adjusts a student's payment schedule based on disbursement dates of financial aid awards, provided the student's home university has completed and returned a finalized Financial Aid Verification Form (FAVF), which is provided once accepted to a program. This FAVF form acts as a deferral for any final payment amount covered by the financial aid. This form must be submitted by the date of the original final payment deadline. Please note that deposits are not allowed to be covered by financial aid and those payments must be submitted by their due dates. This includes the \$150 application deposit, \$400 confirmation payment and \$275 security deposit as well as any additional fees on the API account.

FINANCIAL AID TIMELINE AND CHECKLIST STEP 1

UPON ACCEPTANCE INTO YOUR API PROGRAM, CONTACT YOUR SCHOOL'S FINANCIAL AID OFFICE. Share your study abroad plans and find out their requirements for using your financial aid to pay API. Some universities require that API fill out a Consortium Agreement. If necessary, provide this to API as soon as possible.

STEP 2

ACCESS THE FINANCIAL AID VERIFICATION FORM (FAVF) ON YOUR @API ACCOUNT OR OPEN THE DOCUMENT ATTACHED TO YOUR API ACCEPTANCE BILLING STATEMENT. COMPLETE THE STUDENT PORTION AT THE TOP OF THIS FORM AND SUBMIT IT TO YOUR FINANCIAL AID ADVISOR. Make sure they are aware that the completed and finalized FAVF needs to be submitted to API on or before your final payment due date.

STEP 3

FOLLOW UP REGULARLY WITH YOUR FINANCIAL AID ADVISOR TO ENSURE THAT YOUR FAVF WAS RETURNED TO API. If your aid won't be awarded or can't be finalized by your final payment due date, you should have your financial aid advisor complete a preliminary version of the FAVF.

STEP 4

SUBMIT PAYMENT FOR ANY AMOUNT NOT COVERED BY AID, ANY ADDITIONAL FEES AND THE \$275 SECURITY DEPOSIT on or before your final payment due date.

STEP 5

MAKE ARRANGEMENTS TO GET YOUR FINANCIAL AID FUNDS TO API AS SOON AS THEY ARE DISBURSED. Since, most often, financial aid isn't released until after your program start date, you'll want to ensure that these arrangements are made before you go abroad. Some schools will send the funds to API directly. IT IS THE STUDENT'S RESPONSIBILITY TO MAKE SURE THAT API RECEIVES PAYMENT ON TIME. You will need to stay involved in the financial aid process and be sure to report any changes in your aid to API. Many students are abroad when the funds are disbursed and will need to make arrangements to get payment to API on time.







This program will begin with **two, 5-week intensive academic courses** taught by faculty onsite. Following the intensive courses, the students will participate in a **7-week full time internship placement**. Students complete each component consecutively, which will allow students dedicated time to focus on the academic courses and internship separately, providing a better balance between study and professional development. Some three-day weekends have been built into the program, leaving plenty of time for exploring the rich local culture of the host site. Students will earn letter grades for the coursework, for a total of **12 credit hours** (2 academic courses for 3 credits each, and 6 credits for their internship coursework).

ADDITIONAL OPTIONS FOR STUDENTS STUDYING ABROAD IN FLORENCE

LDM INTERNSHIP OPPORTUNITIES SEMESTER

API students have the opportunity to earn valuable credits through professional internships in Florence with LdM. Italy is known for its artisan and small business structure that offers amazing opportunities for first-hand experience and interaction with local business owners to learn about the strengths and structure of the Italian workplace. Students earn 3 credits for an internship, which are counted toward their total academic load for the semester, and appear on the academic transcript along with a pass/fail grade. Students are assessed based on a weekly internship journal, a minimum of two papers, and an evaluation by their academic advisor/tutor at LdM.

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM SEMESTER

The LdM Professional Opportunities Program offers students a non-credit experiential learning experience. It is similar to an internship, but it requires less time and is based around the completion of a single project. Students are given the opportunity to collaborate with both the LdM Institute and local Florentine businesses, organizations, and associations.

CREATIVE ARTS AND DESIGN CERTIFICATE PROGRAMS SEMESTER / ONE- OR TWO-YEAR

The Certificate Programs are designed for students who have a solid background in one of the following areas: culinary arts, fashion design, fashion marketing and merchandising, graphic design and visual communication, interior design, jewelry art and design, or restoration and conservation. These programs are offered for a semester, or for one or two years in duration, and involve a set curriculum for each specific discipline. All courses, except Italian language, are conducted in English. Certificate program dates and prices are generally the same as the regular LdM Florence programs. An \$800 additional fee is charged for any certificate programs that involve 18 U.S. credits per semester or more.

This program will begin with two, 5-week intensive academic courses taught by faculty onsite. Following the intensive courses, the students will participate in a 7-week full time internship placement. 

STUDY ABROAD AND INTERNSHIP IN SYDNEY

This program will begin with **two**, **5-week intensive academic courses** taught by faculty onsite. Following the intensive courses, the students will participate in a **7-week full time internship placement**. Students complete each component consecutively, which will allow students dedicated time to focus on the academic courses and internship separately, providing a better balance between study and professional development. Some three-day weekends have been built into the program, leaving plenty of time for exploring the rich local culture of the host site. Students will earn letter grades for the coursework, for a total of **12 credit hours** (2 academic courses for 3 credits each, and 6 credits for their internship coursework).

ADDITIONAL OPTIONS AT MACQUARIE UNIVERSITY

STUDY ABROAD CERTIFICATE This program allows students to enroll in a minimum of 3 units in purpose-filled subjects. 

This program will begin with two, 5-week intensive academic courses taught by faculty onsite. Following the intensive courses, the students will participate in a 7-week full time internship placement.

Students complete each component consecutively, which will allow students dedicated time to focus on the academic courses and internship separately, providing a better balance between study and professional development. Some three-day weekends have been built into the program, leaving plenty of time for exploring the rich local culture of the host site.

Students will earn letter grades for the coursework, for a total of 12 credit hours (2 academic courses for 3 credits each, and 6 credits for their internship coursework).
