



Agricultural Experience in Ireland

Day 1

After arriving into Dublin airport and meeting our in-country coordinator, the group will be transferred to their accommodation. The group will have a guided tour of Dublin before the welcome dinner at a traditional restaurant with Irish music and dancing.



Day 2

The day will start with a visit to the world-famous Guinness Storehouse. Following this, the group will head out to the Irish National Stud. The group participants will then be dropped off with their respective host families.

Day 3

The group participants will spend the day with their host families, learning about Irish culture, immersing themselves in the local community and seeing local sites of interest.

Day 4

After saying goodbye to the host families, the group will head south to Cork to visit the Donkey Sanctuary. The students will have the chance to 'kiss the blarney stone' at Blarney Castle, before visiting a Water Buffalo farm and learning about the production of buffalo mozzarella.



Day 5

The group will spend the day at a local agricultural college and engage with students and faculty. In the evening, the group will try their hands at some traditional Irish sports Day 6

The group will head to a local beef and tillage farm in the morning, before visiting an alpaca farm in the afternoon. After this, they will visit a champion sheepdog handler and learn about the process of training a sheepdog. Day 7

After breakfast, the group will have the opportunity to ride horses through the Slieve Bloom Mountains before

having lunch in the library of the beautiful Kinnity Castle, which was built in the 11th century. The group will have a free afternoon in the small town of Birr before heading back to the accommodation. Day 8

The group will be up early to head west towards the Cliffs of Moher. They will also take in Aillwee caves and a bird of prey center before heading back to the accommodation in the evening.

Day 9

The group will attend a one-day competition event, with the opportunity to meet some of the riders, and walk the course. There will be a farewell dinner in the evening.

Day 10

The group will be transferred back to the airport for the flight home.





Program Features

A. Pre-departure Support

Comprehensive pre-departure support from World Endeavors staff members, including a pre-departure orientation or webinar as requested. Participants will also receive a personalized pre-departure handbook.

B. 24 hour Ireland-based support

The group will be chaperoned by a World Endeavors representative throughout the trip.

C. In-Country Orientation

In-depth in-country orientation introducing the group to Irish culture, health and safety issues, and the schedule for the program.

D. Group Accommodations

Accommodation will be in shared or dormitory style rooms throughout the trip, and in shared rooms with the host families.

E. Meals

Breakfast and dinner are included each day, with the exception of arrival and departure days (arrival day – just dinner, departure day – just breakfast) as well as some lunches.

F. In-Country Transportation

Minivans or coach buses included for transfers and sightseeing, local transportation to group activities in itinerary.

G. Airport Reception and Drop-off

Private transfers to and from Dublin International Airport (DUB).

H. Tips

Tips included for tour guides, drivers as required in group activities.
