- The Dax program works with students at DePaul University to provide housing, food stipends, transportation passes, and case management.
- As community psychologists, we value providing skills and resources to community partners in a participatory manner: Capacity Building.

Building Capacity with the Dax Program

- 1. Logic Model
 - Outline the program's theory of change
 - An iterative, collaborative process
- 2. Data Management
 - Organized program data for increased efficiency
- 3. Program Manual
 - Document policies and procedures
 - Invaluable for orienting new staff

Lessons Learned

- Build rapport with community organizations first; this takes time!
- Work on projects that are mutually beneficial.

Future Work

- Needs Assessment
- Restructure internal forms
- Set up program for internal evaluation and monitoring

Focus on evaluation and data capacity building while you foster a new relationship with a community partner; then work on collecting data for mutually-beneficial research.


