Programs may include visits to local hospitals and clinics to learn about professional practice, diagnosis and treatment; a visit to a specialist residence for people with HIV; a visit to a sustainable organic farm to learn about the health benefits of bio-farming.

Costa Rica Health and Human Services Sample Itinerary

Day 3

Day 1

Arrive in San José; AIFS Orientation and welcome walking tour; group dinner

Day 5-7

Weekend excursion to Tortuguero National Park. 2-night lodge accommodation with meals and activities including tour of the canals, trails, garden, beach walk and visit to Pueblo de Tortuguero

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WHAT'S INCLUDED

Academic components

- Site visits to a selection of health and human services agencies and organizations; can include but is not limited to those featured in the sample itinerary
- Guest speakers in the field of health and human services, including public agencies, health care delivery and the promotion of nutrition and public health
- Visits to museums and historical sites with particular relevance to health and human service-related sites
- Day trips outside of San José providing a broader perspective to enhance class learning
- Classroom space for faculty-led classes and discussions
- Unique cross-cultural experiences to provide depth to academic aims

- Faculty participation costs included in student fee or separated out if you prefer
- Dedicated team of AIFS Student Services staff onsite with 24-hour emergency support
- Access to the AIFS student center in San José
- Student accommodation. Options include homestays with meals or tourist class hotels
- Cultural and group activities; dinners, tourist attractions such as Arenal Volcano, Monteverde Cloud Forest and Tortuguero National Park
- Student medical and program fee refund insurance policies, as outlined in the AIFS insurance brochure. Coverage includes \$100,000 accidental death payment plus 24-hour emergency care assistance during the program and repatriation in cases of verified emergency beyond the students' control
- \$51,000,000 liability insurance naming your college or university as co-insured
- AIFS can also arrange an optional group flight with a minimum of 10 passengers
