













Northwest Baltimore offers a wide variety of housing types to meet budgets of all sizes.





Northwest Baltimore is fortunate to have a wide range of natural and community resources such as Druid Hill Park and Cylburn Arboretum as well as community farms and gardens.









Faith-based organizations are strong and play prominent roles organizing and supporting community.






The Pimlico Merchants Association and Park Heights Chamber of Commerce coordinate businesses in the corridor and organize key projects and activities.
