HIGHLIGHTS

Fulfill psychology requirements and conduct research or conduct an internship in psychology while in Madrid, the sixth-largest city in Europe.

This program is geared toward Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Science psychology majors and minors. In addition to psychology classes, round out your program with additional English-taught classes, or Spanish language classes to increase your fluency. You can also choose to take additional courses in English at the local university for an extra fee.

Live either with a Spanish host family or in a dormitory (summer session only).

In a homestay, gain insight into Spanish culture and society while immersing in the Spanish language. Typically, you and your host family will live in an apartment where you will have either a shared or single room, plus study space.

During the summer session, you may choose to live in a dormitory for an additional fee.

Learning Outcomes

- Acquire an international perspective on psychology
- Gain hands-on research or internship experience within the Spanish context
- Deepen cross-cultural understanding through interaction with the local community
- Increase independence and self-reliance by learning to navigate Spanish society







COURSEWORK

Study psychology, gain research experience, and improve your beginning or intermediate Spanish language skills.

The program is offered in partnership with the prestigious Fundación Ortega-Marañón in Madrid and the University of Minnesota.

During the semester program, participate in research and take courses that can fulfill psychology degree requirements:

- Abnormal Psychology
- Cross-Cultural Psychology
- Health Psychology
- Human Neuroanatomy
- Introduction to Biological Psychology
- Psychology in the Workplace
- Sensation and Perception

As well as offerings in other fields.

During the six-week summer program, take courses that can fulfill psychology BA/BS requirements:

- Cross-Cultural Psychology
- Introduction to Biological Psychology
- Psychology in the Workplace
- Research Laboratory in Psychology

During the semester program, you have the option to take beginning or intermediate-level Spanish language as well as English-taught courses that cover a range of topics, including art history, business, communications and media, culture, ecology, finance, marketing, and religion.

You may also take English-taught courses at the Universidad Carlos III de Madrid in communication, engineering, or health sciences. Classes are held Monday through Thursday, leaving Fridays open for research placements. Cultural program excursions will take place occasionally on Fridays.

RESEARCH & INTERNSHIP AREAS

Spanish- and English-speaking research or internship experiences are available in neuroscience and addiction therapy and at psychiatric hospitals. Learn about research techniques next to professionals at the world-renowned Cajal Institute, among other prestigious clinics. Earn 3 credits and spend approximately 75 hours at your research site.

EXCURSIONS

A walking tour of Madrid will help you learn to navigate the city and familiarize you with some of Madrid's iconic landmarks. Day excursions to places such as Alcalá de Henares, El Escorial, and Toledo, as well as a three-day excursion to other parts of Spain, are included in the program fee.

FINANCIAL PLANNING

Most financial aid may be applied to study abroad. In addition, University of Minnesota students are eligible for \$1.5 million in University of Minnesota study abroad scholarships. For more information about other financial resources, visit the Learning Abroad Center website.
