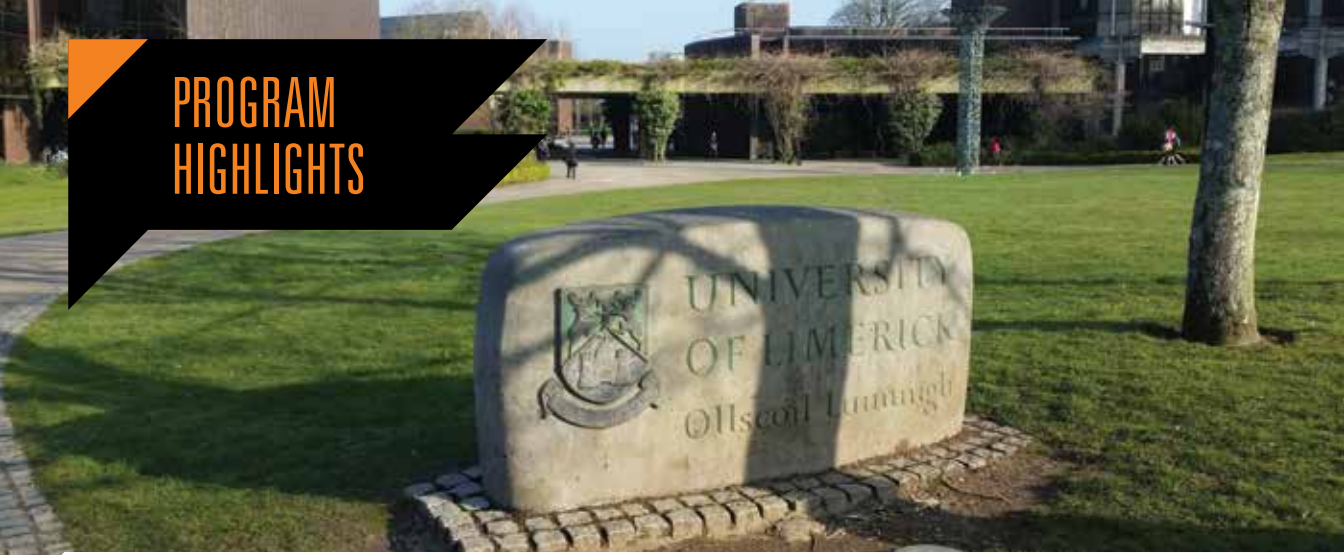

Housing & Meals

Live on campus with Irish and other international students in apartment-style or shared dormitories. You will have your own room and share kitchen facilities with your flatmates or housemates. Some residences offer private, en-suite bathrooms, but most have shared bathrooms. You will prepare your meals in the residence villages or dine at on-campus restaurants.

Excursions

Extracurricular activities abound at the University of Limerick. The International Office organizes a number of off-campus activities each semester, including a special Thanksgiving dinner and organized trips to Dublin and western Ireland tourist attractions. Many of the 60+ clubs and societies organize day and weekend trips. Student residences organize dinners, dances, and other activities.

COURSEWORK

Earn 13–30 credits in a variety of subjects in your major or minor or for liberal education requirements. The University of Limerick is a comprehensive, innovative university with a strong focus on experiential learning. It is popular with students of humanities and social sciences and an ideal destination for students of engineering, exercise science, information technology, and business.

A dedicated Nursing track allows School of Nursing students in their senior year to stay on track to graduate by taking major courses and participating in a practicum at a local clinic or hospital.

The university also offers a three-week summer session for international students. During this session, you can take one course from disciplines such as Irish studies, health sciences, or business.

Spanning two sides of the River Shannon and two counties (Limerick and Clare), the University of Limerick's campus is considered one of the most picturesque in Ireland. The university houses state-of-the-art sporting facilities, and you can watch or participate in anything from traditional Gaelic games, such as hurling, to Limerick's favorite sport, rugby.

Located just three miles from downtown, the campus is ideally situated to maximize student life on campus while providing easy access to an urban center. Limerick City offers a mix of the historical—museums, castles, Irish music—and the modern. It is recognized as a technology center and is home to many well-known tech companies.

Limerick is also an ideal base from which to explore Ireland's western coastal region. The area contains some of Ireland's most striking natural features, such as the Dingle Peninsula and the Cliffs of Moher, as well as several Gaeltachtaí, or Irish-speaking, regions.
