The Capacity Building Program for U.S. Study Abroad, also known as IDEAS (Increase and Diversify Education Abroad for U.S. Students), is a program of the U.S. Department of State with funding provided by the U.S. Government and supported in its implementation by World Learning. The initiative seeks to expand higher education institutions' capacity to increase and diversify study abroad programs for U.S. students through the provision of grants and capacity building activities.

In collaboration with the U.S. Department of State, World Learning manages a competitive review process to award approximately 21 grants of up to \$35,000 to accredited higher education institutions in the United States. The program also offers faculty and staff at U.S. colleges and universities opportunities to participate in a series of study abroad capacity building activities, both virtual and in-person, to help create, expand, or diversify their study abroad programs. Resources from these activities are shared with the wider study abroad community in the program's virtual resource library at studyabroadcapacitybuilding.org.

PROGRAM GOALS AND OUTCOMES



Diversify American student mobility, both in terms of the students taking part and the destinations where they travel.



Increase the number of U.S. undergraduate students studying or interning abroad for credit.



Share study abroad best practices through an in-person community and virtual library of resources.

IDEAS GRANT COMPETITION

In collaboration with the U.S. Department of State, World Learning manages a competitive review process to award grants of up to \$35,000 to accredited higher education institutions in the United States to expand and diversify U.S. student mobility overseas. Grant recipients will build institutional capacity and increase and diversify U.S. student mobility overseas in support of U.S. foreign policy goals.

Program Examples:

- Create a faculty-led study abroad program,
- Create a new study abroad position at the college or university,
- Support minority student participation in study abroad,
- Provide resources for students with disabilities to study abroad,
- Create programming for students in underrepresented majors,
- Form relationships with universities in a variety of international locations.

All programs help advance U.S. foreign policy goals such as countering disinformation, democracy and human rights, energy and natural resources, entrepreneurship and economic development, global health, and religious freedom.

IDEAS INITIATIVES

The IDEAS Initiatives will expand and diversify U.S. student mobility overseas by providing the U.S. study abroad community with in-person workshops, webinars, and virtual resources. Study abroad stakeholders at U.S. higher education institutions will have opportunities to share their own study abroad best practices and to network with and learn from their peers about study abroad capacity building.
